

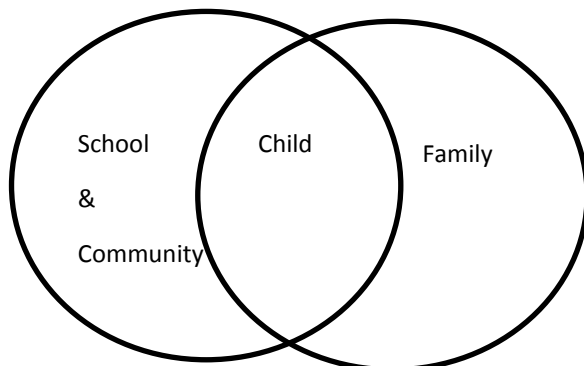
Family Engagement

Ysgol Hen Felin is a Local Authority special school, providing education for pupils (3-19 years) with profound, moderate, severe and complex special needs. It is one of 4 special schools in RCT.

We have **approx. 180** pupils on role. There are 15 classes in the main building of the school with a satellite provision of **2** Post 16 classes based in Rhondda Campus of Coleg y Cymoedd.

At Ysgol hen Felin we pride ourselves in providing the best quality education and experiences for all our pupils which are fun, motivating and challenging. Our mission statement is 'Learning and Working Together to Enrich Lives'.
